- 1.- **Chile** (Declaration of Valdivia 2002 – proposal of integration in Health Reform – AUGE)
- 2.- **Argentina** (Declaration of Buenos Aires 2003 – Implementation of Renal Health Program for Social Security)
- 3.- **México** (Acapulco 2003). (Querétaro 2006. First joint meeting between the Mexican Society of Nephrology and the Mexican Institute of Nephrology Investigations: agreement of collaboration to integrate the Mexican Committee of Renal Health and to reach the Renal Health in Mexico)
- 4.- **Uruguay** (Pronouncement of Montevideo 2004 – Renal Health Program Implementation. At present the program is in full implementation)
- 5.- **Paraguay** (Declaration of Asunción 2004 – National Health Budget for High Complexity Disease – FONARESS)
- 6.- **Venezuela** (Declaration of Caracas 2004 – CAREM Initiative), (Workshop of Merida 2006, to implement a Regional Program of Renal Health in Province of Andes)
- 7.- **Colombia** (Declaration of Bogotá 2004 – Design of Renal Health Model. Prevention and Control of Chronic Kidney Disease Component – Preparation of Clinical Guidelines 2005) (Workshop of Barranquilla 2006, to implement a Regional Program of Renal Health on the Caribbean coast. Declaration of Barranquilla)
- 8.- **Ecuador** (Declaration of Guayaquil 2005, without later development)
- 9.- **Puerto Rico** (Renal Health Model for Puerto Rico – PAHO Document 2005), (Creation of the Committee of Renal Health in the Secretary of Health of the State 2006)
- 10.- **Perú** (Workshop of Lima 2005). (Inclusion of the component Renal Health, inside the Program of not transmissible Illnesses of the Ministry of Health 2006)
- 11.- **Brasil** (Letter Intention of Brasilia 2006, for the development and the implementation of a Model of promotion of health, prevention, control and treatment of the cardiovascular, cerebral, renal and endocrine metabolic illnesses)
